Dear RFR Coordinator,

The 2018 Retirement Fund for Religious (RFR) collection is approaching, and I ask your assistance in encouraging a generous response. Pages 2 and 3 of this guide offer an overview of the resources our office provides and suggestions for easy ways to use these materials to promote the appeal. The most important step is to urge pastors to announce the RFR collection from the pulpit.

The national collection is scheduled for **December 8–9**, although your (arch)diocese may choose to hold it on an alternate weekend. Enclosed are samples of our printed campaign materials, which are free for parishes and which you may have requested. These items are shipped approximately four to eight weeks prior to the collection date entered for your (arch)diocese in the National Collections database.

(Arch)bishops will receive a one-page resource letter that is sent electronically. The letter will include links to various promotional materials and will encourage them to distribute a letter to parishioners in support of the collection. (*See back page.*)

Encourage pastors to announce the collection from the pulpit. Where possible, organize RFR speakers to make the appeal in parishes.



Sample Letter: (Arch)bishops to Parishioners (English and Spanish)

Dear Friends in Christ,

Soon our parishes will be conducting the Retirement Fund for Religious collection. This annual appeal benefits 31,000 elderly Catholic sisters, brothers, and religious order priests—women and men who have consecrated their lives to serving God and the Church.

During the 2018 World Day for Consecrated Life, Pope Francis remarked, "There is no growth without roots and no flowering without new buds." This analogy has certainly born out within the life of the Church in the United States. Senior religious were the roots that established Catholic schools, hospitals, and social service agencies—allowing generations of Catholics to flourish. Today, the example of older religious inspires younger members to persevere in mission and ministry.

Yet many religious communities struggle to provide for aging members. Most elder religious served for small stipends, leaving a large gap in retirement savings. Rising health-care costs and decreased income compound the struggle to provide adequate care. Your gift to the Retirement Fund for Religious provides vital funding for medications, nursing care, and more. It also helps religious congregations implement long-range retirement strategies, even as they continue to serve the People of God.

I recognize this is but one of numerous worthy causes in need of assistance; I ask simply that you give what you can. In thanksgiving for their faithful service, please join me in supporting the Retirement Fund for Religious and in praying for God's blessing on our nation's elderly religious. Pronto nuestras parroquias llevarán a cabo la colecta anual del Fondo para la Jubilación de Religiosos. Esta campaña anual beneficia a más de 31,000 hermanas, hermanos y sacerdotes católicos de órdenes religiosas — mujeres y hombres que han dedicado su vida en servicio a los demás.

El Papa Francisco, durante la Jornada Mundial de la Vida Consagrada en 2018, destacó que "no hay crecimiento sin raíces y no hay florecimiento sin brotes nuevos." Esta analogía ha sido comprobada en la vida de la Iglesia en los Estados Unidos. Los miembros mayores de órdenes religiosas fueron la base de las escuelas católicas, hospitales y agencias de servicio social, y permitieron el progreso de generaciones de católicos. Hoy día el ejemplo de los religiosos mayores inspira a los miembros más jóvenes a perseverar en su misión y ministerio.

Sin embargo, muchas comunidades religiosas luchan para poder cuidar a sus miembros ancianos. La mayoría de los religiosos mayores recibieron estipendios muy bajos que dejaron una gran carencia en los fondos para su jubilación. Los crecientes costos de la atención médica y los ingresos reducidos agravan la lucha por ofrecer una atención adecuada. Su donativo al Fondo para la Jubilación de Religiosos proporciona fondos vitales para recetas médicas, enfermeros y más. También ayuda a los institutos religiosos a establecer estrategias de jubilación a largo plazo que permitan continuar sirviendo al Pueblo de Dios.

Reconozco que esto es una de muchas causas nobles en necesidad de ayuda; solo les pido que donen lo que puedan. En agradecimiento por el servicio fiel de los religiosos mayores, les pido que se unan a mí para brindar apoyo al Fondo para la Jubilación de Religiosos y rogar a Dios que derrame sus bendiciones en los religiosos de avanzada edad en nuestra nación.
