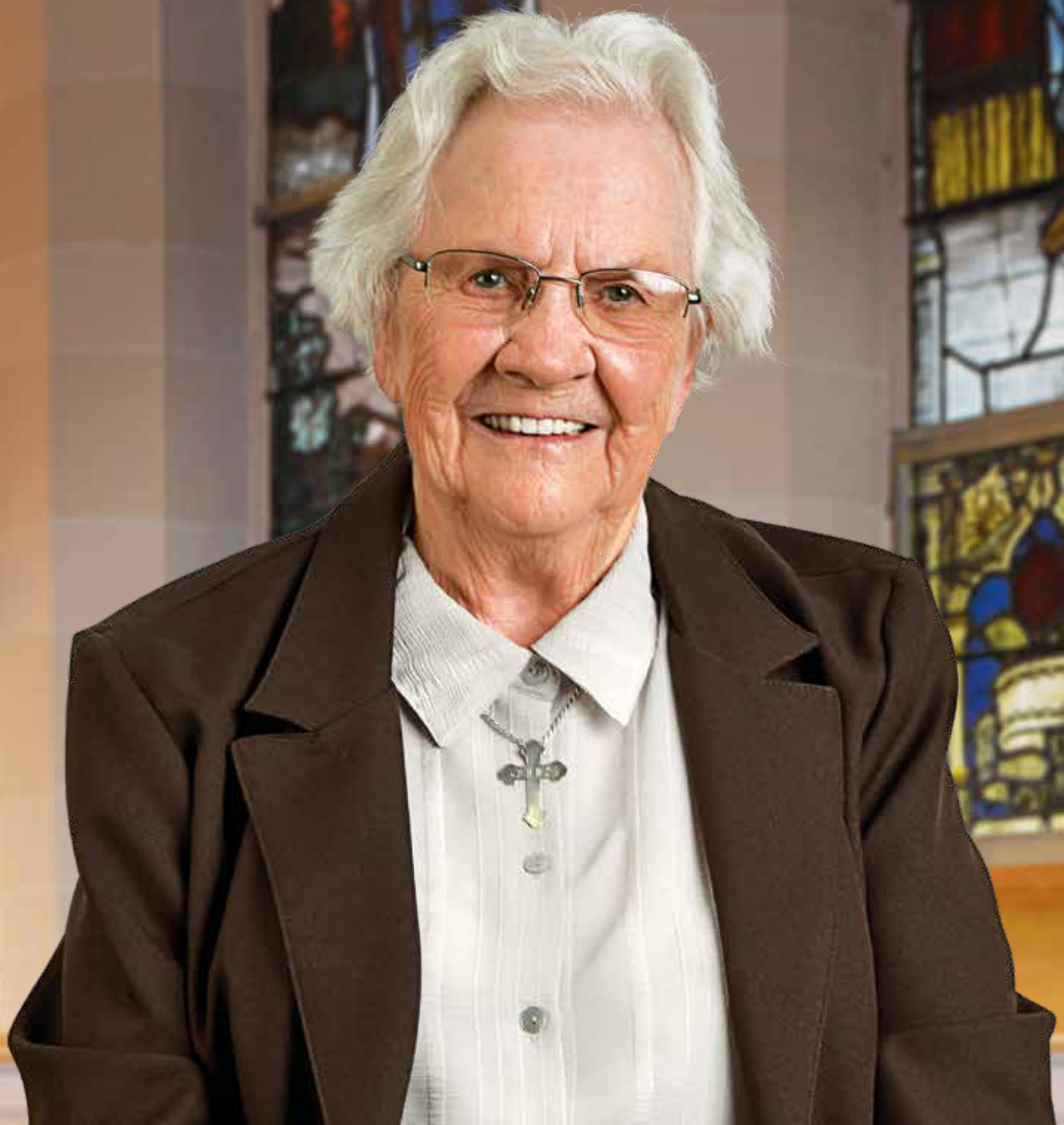


# National Religious Retirement Office









2021 Annual Report Supplement

## Funding Status

In 2021, 517 religious communities provided data to the National Religious Retirement Office (NRRO) regarding their assets available for retirement. From this information, the NRRO calculated the extent to which a community is adequately funded for retirement. Shown below are the number of religious institutes at each level of funding and the total number of women and men religious represented by these institutes.

Dear Friends,

Thanks to concerned Catholics nationwide, nearly \$28.5 million was donated to the Retirement Fund for Religious collection in 2021. This supplement to the National Religious Retirement Office (NRRO) annual report offers a detailed, state-by-state list of the 271 religious communities that received funding because of this generosity. Despite remarkable and ongoing support of the collection, our daily work with religious communities reveals that too many are struggling with insufficient retirement savings. Of the congregations providing data to our office, the largest single grouping is those with 20 percent or less of the funds needed for retirement (*see chart at left*).

Because of this profound need, the NRRO Management Committee decided to distribute \$30 million in financial assistance for the direct care of elderly religious. The portion of funding that exceeded what was collected in the 2021 appeal was realized through investments and careful fiscal management.

Our office strives to distribute financial and educational resources that help religious congregations address their retirement-funding shortages. We offer deepest thanks to the community of Catholics who support these efforts and share our vision of ensuring that congregations can adequately care for their aging members. Our gratitude for your collaboration is matched only by our prayers that God will bless you abundantly.

## Direct Care Assistance

The 2021 collection for the Retirement Fund for Religious enabled the National Religious Retirement Office (NRRO) to distribute Direct Care Assistance to 271 religious institutes. These funds support the immediate care of elder religious and help religious institutes bolster retirement savings.

Direct Care Assistance is an annual, per capita distribution based on specified criteria, including the level of need. Funds are sent to each eligible institute's central house.

An additional 246 religious institutes submitted demographic and financial data to the NRRO. Some provided information but did not request financial assistance. Others applied but did not receive funding because they were adequately funded per the NRRO distribution calculation. Planning and Implementation Assistance

Planning and Implementation Assistance is an initiative that provides consultative and financial support to help struggling religious communities meet ongoing retirement expenses. Since 2009, when the program was launched, nearly 150 congregations have taken part in the process. Many have successfully deployed strategies to address their funding deficits and are now adequately funded for retirement.

Because fewer religious communities are able to meet the criteria for participation, the NRRO is no longer accepting applications for the program. However, all current participants will have the opportunity to complete the process.

Communities may request funds for both the planning and the implementation phases.
